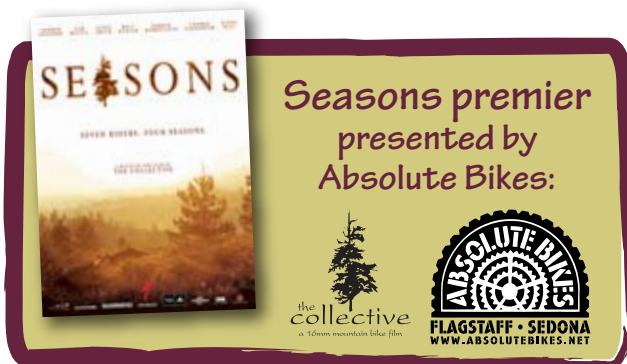
**Thursday, May 15<sup>th</sup>**  
Bike to School Day!

We are once again encouraging parents to bike with their kids to school or in the case of high school students: leave the car at home for a day.

- \* A "Cycle Train" will be demonstrated at Thomas Elementary School to encourage younger kids to ride their bikes to school by providing adult "conductors" while they learn life-long healthy habits.
- \* Local riders and racers will be going into schools and talking about the joys of bicycling and try and teach safe riding while they are at it.
- \* The "Golden Sprocket" Award goes to the high school or middle school with highest bike commuter participation rate. Last year Sinagua High School took the award; who will win this year?
- \* A short film contest was launched to see which school can create the most innovative bicycle movie! We'll watch the five finalists at the Orpheum on Thursday night.

**Awards and the premier of Seasons at the Orpheum Theater 6pm**

We will conclude the worksite challenge with the presentation of the Breezer Freedom Commuter bikes to the winning businesses at the Orpheum Theatre. After the ceremony, we'll view the winners of the 1st annual Bike to Work Week Short Film Competition. As a climax to the evening, we'll show the premier of "Seasons", a film about some of the world's best and most interesting mountain bikers, told through the course of four seasons in one year.
